
Novena with Saint Peter, Blessed Bernhard and Erich Klausener

Novena in gratitude for the Gabriel Monastery and for the preservation of the eternal worship of Jesus Christ in the heart of the German capital Berlin.

Intention and background:

Important holy places in Berlin, such as the Gabriel Monastery and the Church of the Annunciation of Mary, are in a state of upheaval.

The future of the spiritual use of the Gabriel Monastery now lies with us, the People of God, the entire Church and the Vatican.

We would like to join the martyrs, first and foremost Saint Peter, the martyrs of Berlin, Blessed Bernhard, Dr. Erich Klausener, Pastor August Froehlich, Archpriest G.R. Paul Ernst Gediga, Pastor Albert Hirsch, Pastor Joseph Lenzel, Chaplain Herbert Simoleit, Rev. Dr. Alfons Maria Wachsmann, Pastor Albert Willimsky, Eva-Maria Buch, Arno Ertner, Dr. Alfred Etscheid, Rudolf Mandrella, Lieselott Neumark, Alice Reis, Dr. Karl Heinrich Schäfer, Hellmuth Stieff, Maria Terwiel and Joseph Wirmer pray that the Holy Spirit will enlighten and guide us all and above all the decision-makers of the future of the monastery.

The monastery of St. Gabriel and the Church of the Annunciation of Mary were built on the initiative of Blessed Bernhard Lichtenberg. His intention was to establish the monastery of St. Gabriel in Berlin as a center of prayer against the totalitarian evil of the Nazi regime. Blessed Bernhard was finally violently persecuted by the National Socialist regime and died on the way to the Dachau concentration camp. Since 1936, on his initiative, the Sisters of the Congregation of the Servants of

the Holy Spirit of Perpetual Adoration, the "Pink Sisters", have been praying continuously for Berlin in this place. The Order left the monastery at the beginning of the year.

Economically secure concepts envisage continuing the monastery spiritually, accommodating religious orders and carrying out social work.

Let us give thanks again for the strong service of the sisters and continue to pray for the spiritual future of the place and the Order. By storming the dear God in the name of Jesus Christ with Saint Peter, with Blessed Bernhard Lichtenberg, the martyrs of Rome and Berlin, with the Holy Archangels Gabriel, Michael and Raphael and above all with the Blessed Virgin and Mother of God, Mary, the Immaculate Bride of the Holy Spirit who is our Mother.

Let us begin the novena on 5 November, the feast day of Blessed Bernard. We ask you to spend an additional 30-60 minutes in your church, your chapel, in front of the tabernacle in front of the Blessed Sacrament, to be quiet with Mary, with Mary and, like Mary, to be there only for Jesus.

So that I may become Amor et Deliciae, love and delight to all, my surroundings, my family, my colleagues.

Almighty God and Father, You have Bl. Bernhard Lichtenberg in Berlin as a witness to the love of your Son Jesus Christ. Bl. Bernhard thus became the brother of the poor, the afflicted and persecuted, the tormented and outcasts, the doomed Jews and the allegedly "unworthy of life" handicapped. Because he did not want to remain silent about the truth, those in power put him to death.

Blessed Bernard, with you we thank you for the service of the servants of the Holy Spirit of Perpetual adoration, the "pink sisters", we ask for your intercession for the preservation of the uninterrupted adoration of Jesus Christ in the heart of the German capital Berlin.

You dear and strong Archangels Gabriel, Michael and Rafael talk to us, argue with us, heal us. Saint Peter you are the rock of the Church, pray for us. You Saint Joseph, patron saint of the Holy Church and our Father help.

You Blessed Virgin and Mother of God, You are the Immaculate Bride of the Holy Spirit, You are our Mother, speak for us to Your Son our brother Jesus.

So we ask to Almighty and Triune God, through Christ our Lord.

From the testimonies of the beatification process:

"When Bernhard Lichtenberg celebrated Holy Mass, he did so very conscientiously, concentrated, with convincing respect for the sacred mystery. For him, the Blessed Sacrament was the center of his liturgical piety. I felt in him the reverence for the presence of God in the sacrament of the altar. Even in the poorest dwelling, which he entered during visits to the sick, he behaved as reverently in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament as in the church. I have experienced this several times. As a result, the poorest room became a sacred space.

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

Blessed Bernhard: pastor in Berlin

From the testimonies of the beatification process:

"Every Wednesday he [d. Sel. Bernhard] left the church at 5.30 in the morning to care for the sick. He always walked in the Rochett, with the burse visible in his hand. When no altar boy accompanied him, he carried the lantern himself. So he walked through the streets [of Charlottenburg]. Once he encountered a garbage collection car. When the coachman saw him, he gave the servant of God a slap in the face with his whip. When he came back, he told me, 'Today I got thresh.' He didn't want the man to be reported."

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

Be truthful in your actions. Never break your word. Don't show false prestige. Come first – go last. Have righteous anger, but never waste your wrath.

Blessed Bernard, as a preacher

From a manuscript of Sel. Bernhard of 9 January 1928:

"Why do some sermons have no effect? This will probably be due to the preacher. Maybe he didn't pray well enough before, maybe he didn't prepare well enough, maybe he is unwell. But sometimes it's also down to the listeners who don't let the preacher rest. [...] When his listener, sitting or standing in the aisle or at the altar of Mary, opens the book during his sermon and reads it diligently, the poor preacher constantly runs through the thoughts of his sermon Thoughts that do not belong in the sermon, something like this: Why does he want to read from the book now? Why does he come to the sermon if he does not want to listen? Does he might even annoy you and make you understand: What you are preaching, I already know, your sermon does not interest me at all? Because these unseemly thoughts always run through his sermon thoughts, they naturally disturb the context of his thoughts and inhibit the flow of his speech. He begins to falter, loses the thread, gets a headache, quickly searches for the Amen and leaves the pulpit beaten. [...] Preaching sounds easier than it is. Pray for your poor preachers!"

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

How can greater driving forces be found for the construction of a divinely ordained order of social life than from the ideas that led us to the communion bench?

And they were silent and did not tell anyone in those days about what they had seen.

Blessed Bernard praying

From the protocol of the Secret State Police for the interrogation of Bl. Bernhard on 25 October 1941:

"Every evening I pray with my congregation for the severely afflicted non-Aryan Christians, for the Jews, for the prisoners in the concentration camps, especially for the imprisoned priests and religious, especially for the priests of our diocese, for the people tempted to unbelief, despair and suicide, for the millions of nameless and stateless refugees, for the struggling, wounded and dying soldiers over and over again, for the bombed cities in land of friends and foes, etc., and the passage from the general church prayer for the fatherland and the leaders of the people."

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

The lay apostolate we want to exercise is conceived in the broadest sense... We want to take things from the pastors that they cannot do themselves. Moreover, and this is the main thing, we all want to be apostles [and] disciples.

Blessed Bernard as a prophet

From the letter of protest of Bl. Bernhard from 26 August 1941 to Reichsärzteführer Leonardo Conti (1900–1945) for the killing of the mentally ill:

"A short time ago there was a stunned mother in my office. [...] A week ago, she had received news from a provincial sanatorium and nursing home that her 38-year-old son had died of lip boils and meningitis and had been burned. [...] God alone knows how many thousands or sixty thousand times these cases have been repeated. The public must not know, and the relatives fear [...] for their freedom and their lives if they publicly object.

Also on my priestly soul lies the burden of complicity in the crimes against the moral law and the state law. But even if I am only one, I demand from you, Mr. Reichsärzteführer, as a human being, Christian, priest and German, accountable for the crimes committed on Your behest or with your approval, and the Lord's vengeance on the German people over life and death."

Blessed Bernard as an emergency helper

Again Peter denied, and immediately a crowed.

Pulpit announcement of Bl. Bernhard (prepared for Sunday, October 26, 1941), found and confiscated by the Gestapo during the house search in the cathedral provost on October 23, 1941:

"An anonymous hate paper against the Jews is being distributed in Berlin houses. It claims that any German who, out of alleged false sentimentality, somehow supports the Jews, even if only by friendly accommodation, is betraying his people.

Do not allow yourselves to be deterred by this unchristian attitude, but act according to the strict commandment of Jesus Christ: 'Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself,[1]'"

Words of Erich Klausener:



He saw the linen bandages lying 7 and the sweat cloth that had been lying on Jesus' head; but it was not with the linen bandages, but tied together next to it in a special place. 8 Then the other disciple, who had come first to the tomb, went in; He saw and believed.

From the last surviving letter of Bl. Bernhard of 26 September 1943 from the military hospital of the prison:

"When I look at the last two years from here, I want to and must thank God with all my soul, including all those who carried out His holy will on me. It is my firm resolve to carry out, with God's help, the retreat resolutions that I made years ago after the thirty-day retreat, namely: I will see everything that happens to me, joyful and painful, uplifting and oppressive in the light of eternity, I will possess my soul in my patience[1], I do not want in any thought, sin in no word or in any work, and do all things out of love, and suffer all things out of love. — I still have the courage to live for 20 years, but if the good Lord wants me to die today, His holy will shall be done."

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

Peace is more than non-war. Peace means reconciliation, rapprochement, calm in order, humanity for all people. Peace is only possible through human rethinking. Above all, all mistrust must be banished from the heart.

Blessed Bernard, as a martyr

From the letter of condolence of the Archbishop of Breslau Adolf Cardinal Bertram (1859-1945) of 8 November 1943:

"Seldom has a news shaken me as deeply as the news of the tragic end of your brother, the dear cathedral provost of Berlin. I have always had a high veneration for him because he appeared to me to be one of the noblest priests I have met in my long life. Filled with depth of faith and genuine piety, restlessly pastoral work, open to all the problems of the present, manfully courageous in word and action: so he was an ornament of the Berlin clergy. What I find incomprehensible is the statement of the doctor and the Reich Security Main Office, which arranged for the transfer to Dachau. Your brother remains in my memory as a martyr of his disposition. Requiescat in sancta pace."

Impulse by Erich Klausener:

The Catholic Church is not international, it is universal. It marries every people on earth, but it must claim for itself by virtue of its divine mission to lead the souls of all peoples to God the Creator at the end of the world.

Blessed Bernhard,

From the homily of Bl. John Paul II on the occasion of the beatification of Bernhard Lichtenberg in Berlin on June 23, 1996:

"That the new Blessed was a saint of intercessory prayer is shown not only in this prayer for the Jews and the prisoners in the concentration camps, it is also shown in his prayer for the spiritual vocations. He was a tireless promoter of the apostolate for priestly vocations. His beatification should therefore be a call to celebrate the World Day and the monthly days of prayer for vocations with renewed devotion and confidence. [...]

The example of Blessed Bernard calls us to become 'collaborators for the truth'. Do not be deterred when God and the Christian faith are maligned or ridiculed even in our day. Remain faithful to the truth that is Christ. Speak up courageously when false principles lead to wrong deeds, when human dignity is violated or the moral order of God is called into question".

Peter: His name was actually Simon, but Jesus called him Peter. Born in Bethsaida, he lived and worked as a fisherman in Capernaum on the Sea of Galilee. Together with his brother Andrew, he was called by Jesus to follow him and together with the Fischer brothers John and James. On his walk at the side of the Messiah, Peter appears as a simple, simple and blunt man. The Gospel explains that Jesus chose a simple fisherman without further education to lead His Church.

In the capital of the empire, Rome, Peter encouraged and led the church. During the persecutions under Emperor Nero, Peter is captured again and crucified upside down, at his own request. Paul, on the other hand, is beheaded as a citizen of Rome. Tradition has it that the martyrdom of the two took place on the same day, on June 29 of the year 67. Peter died in Nero's circus on Vatican Hill, Paul on the road to Ostia. On their graves today stand St. Peter's Basilica or St. Paul outside the walls.

Bernhard Lichtenberg was born on 3 December 1875 in Ohlau in Silesia. As an exemplary pious priest (1899), cathedral priest (1932) and cathedral provost (1938), he worked tirelessly and fearlessly in pastoral care and charity in Berlin. Because of public prayer for the persecuted Jews and criticism of the »euthanasia« murders, he was arrested by the Secret State Police on October 23, 1941 and then sentenced by a special court on May 22, 1942. Seriously ill after two years in prison, he died on the transport to the Dachau concentration camp on 5 November 1943 in Hof. His beatification as a martyr took place in Berlin by Bl. Pope John Paul II on June 23, 1996. The tomb of Bl. Bernhard is now in the lower church of St. Hedwig's Cathedral in Berlin.

Dr. Erich Klausener was born in Düsseldorf in 1885. After studying law, his experiences as a lieutenant in the First World War brought him into close contact with the needs of the poor. After the war he was a civil servant, the convinced Catholic centrist forced his political Gegnern bis hin zu den Kommunisten etwa als sogenannter "roter Landrat" Respekt ab.

In 1924 he became ministerial director in Berlin, with his wife and son he moved to Schöneberg and found his ecclesiastical home in the parish of St. Matthias, where he also became a member of the

church council. As ministerial director in the Prussian Ministry of the Interior from 1926, he campaigned against extremism from the right and left as well as against sexual exploitation. Among other things, he tried, unfortunately in vain, to expel the Austrian Adolf Hitler from Germany because of the Crimes of the NSDAP. So he attracted the hatred of the Nazis.

In the nascent diocese of Berlin, he was entrusted with the leadership of Catholic Action in 1928. Through the courageous commitment of Klausener, Catholic Action strengthened the sense of togetherness of Berlin's Catholics. This was evident in the annual Märkische Katholikentage, in June 1934 more than 60,000 Catholics gathered again at the Hoppegarten racecourse and professed Christ as the one to whom they wanted to remain faithful. In a spontaneous speech, Klausener denounced the new government's violations of the law against the Church. Only one week later, on 30 June 1934, he was shot in the back in his office in the Ministry of Transport at the special request of Prussian Prime Minister Hermann Göring. Since 1963, Erich Klausener's urn has found a worthy resting place in the memorial church Maria Regina Martyrum in Berlin.

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
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
